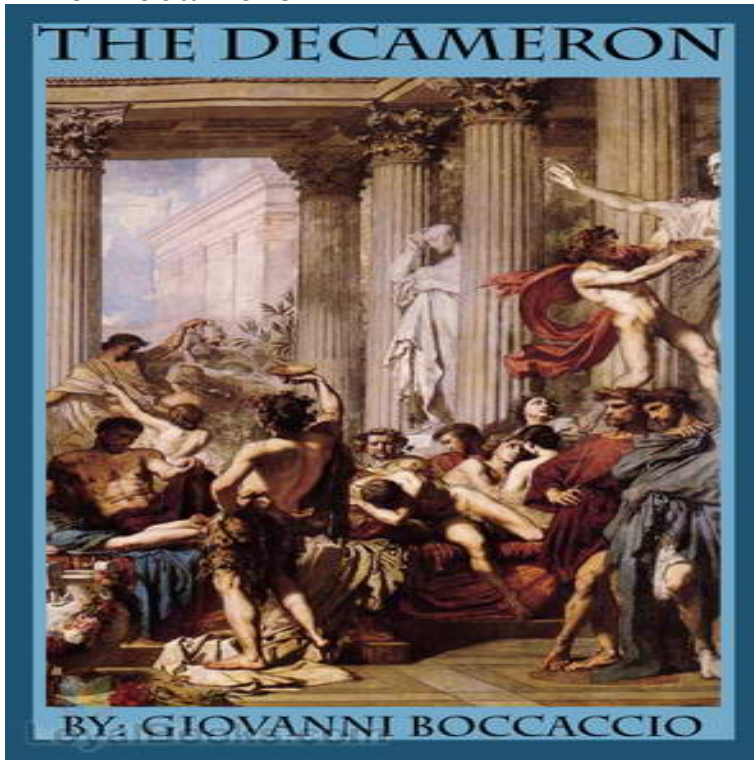


# The Decameron
